How We Got Started

The question always comes up: How did People for People get its start back in 2003?

Well, People for People started out as a Rotary Club project that was only going to run for one year. Bernadette Blackstock was the president of the Mullica Hill Rotary Club back then and she wanted to start a program that would have an impact on the local community. After much research and discussion People for People was formed. Its mission was to provide small monetary grants and advocacy to families in Gloucester County that were normally self sufficient that were experiencing a family crisis due to no fault of their own. These were families that would be classified as the "Working Poor." Their incomes which in most cases were low, but unfortunately just above the limits where they could not readily qualify to receive government assistance. Too much to receive traditional assistance, but not enough to eradicate their needs. You can say they "Fell through the cracks" and had very few options available to them.

The initial goal was to try to help one family per month for the one year and then stop. Because of the overwhelming response received from people seeking assistance the first month when PFP received over 100 calls, it was decided to form a separate 501 c 3 foundation and continue the program into the future.

Bernadette and her husband Paul ran PFP from their home as volunteers for over six years raising funds for PFP and providing help and advocacy to help those in need. During this time the Blackstocks also ran their own life and health insurance agency but eventually realized that they couldn't continue to do both. So, in 2009 they decided to slowly divest themselves from their insurance business and devote their full time to PFP. Bernadette became an employee of PFP and today serves as the President and CEO. Paul continued his work for PFP as a volunteer.

What started as a small Rotary project has turned into an organization that has had a great impact for those seeking help. Instead of helping 12 families as was its goal initially, today People for People has helped over 12,000 people and adds to that number every day with assistance with food, clothing, utilities, medications, and many other items to help people in need. Just in 2014 alone People for People fielded over 2000 requests for help. Working out of a local warehouse People for People has six part time employees and numerous volunteers. PFP is the only organization in Gloucester County that is authorized to administer the Payment Assistance for Gas and Electric (PAGE) program and is also authorized to administer New Jersey Shares assistance. People for People also serves as the Lead Agency for the Pascale Sykes Foundation initiative Heart of Gloucester County which was made up of five other organizations with the mission of strengthening families.

People for People is also dedicated to helping our veteran community. They are the driving force behind the annual regional Vets Picnic as well as the Wreaths of Remembrance which has laid 36,000 wreaths over the past 14 years on the graves of our veterans at the Gloucester County Veterans Memorial Cemetery. People for People developed a low to moderate income housing community with a veteran preference called Camp Salute. More information on this project will be in our next newsletter.

From a small club project run by volunteers to a wide reaching organization helping thousands of people over the years with their emergent and other needs, People for People has come a long way and is continuing to grow.

Cove at Palmyra—Palmyra

Family development located in Palmyra, NJ. Family development with 8 set-aside units for veterans at risk of homelessness. Completion scheduled for 2025.

Liberty Landing - East Greenwich

Liberty Landing located in East Greenwich, NJ. Family development with 70 total units of 1, 2, and 3 bedrooms with 35 Veteran Preference Units. 5 units designated for veterans at risk of being homeless. Completion scheduled for 2025.
