2025 continues to be a year of progress.

Since 2003 when *People for People Foundation* (a 501c3 grassroots organization) started, our organization (along with partner agencies) has assisted numerous individuals and families with utility assistance along with providing valuable resource and referral services.

People for People still partners with **SHARES**. As you may know, Shares provides energy assistance to moderate and lower-income households experiencing a financial crisis. Eligibility is based on household size and income.

People for People supports the **SHARES** programs with processing and submitting applications from **eligible** clients in need.

As we enter mid-year, *People for People* has processed approximately 98 applicants needing utility assistance with funds of over \$46,700 granted to clients; and there's more to come.

FATHER'S DAY

Father's Day is a holiday honoring one's father, as well as fatherhood, paternal bonds, and the influence of fathers in society. The holiday complements similar celebrations honoring family members, such as Mother's Day and, in some countries, Siblings Day, and Grandparents Day. The day is held on various dates across the world, and different regions maintain their own traditions of honoring fatherhood.

In Catholic countries of Europe, it has been celebrated on 19 March as Saint Joseph's Day since the Middle Ages. In the United States, Father's Day was founded in the state of Washington by Sonora Smart Dodd in 1910. Father's Day is a recognized public holiday in Lithuania and some parts of Spain and was regarded as such in Italy until 1977. It is a national holiday in Estonia, Samoa, and equivalently in South Korea, where it is celebrated as Parents' Day. Sikhs celebrate Father's Day on 29 December, birthday of Guru Gobind Singh.

In the United States, Father's Day is not a federal holiday. Organizations, businesses and stores are open or closed, just as they are on any other Sunday in the year. Public transit systems run to their normal Sunday schedules. Restaurants may be busier than usual, as some people take their fathers out for a treat.

Legally, Father's Day is a state holiday in Arizona. However, because it always falls on a Sunday, most state government offices and employees observe their Sunday schedule on the day.

Father's Day is an occasion to mark and celebrate the contribution that your own father has made to your life. Many people send or give cards or gifts to their fathers. Common Father's Day gifts include sports items or clothing, electronic gadgets, outdoor cooking supplies and tools for household maintenance.

Father's Day is a relatively modern holiday, so different families have a range of traditions. These can range from a simple phone call or greeting card to large parties honoring all of the 'father' figures in a particular extended family. Father figures can include fathers, step-fathers, fathers-in-law, grandfathers and great-grandfathers and even other male relatives. In the days and weeks before Father's Day, many schools and Sunday schools help their pupils to prepare a handmade card or small gift for their fathers.

This year Father's Day in the United States will be held on **Sunday, June 15, 2025**.



JUNE EVENTS & OBSERVANCES

June kicks off the summer fun. School's out, days are long, and everyone's dreaming of a break.

But it's not just about vacations — this month is packed with meaningful moments, too. In June, people relax and reflect.

June in the U.S. is a time to celebrate freedom, culture, and history. There aren't many nationwide holidays, but the ones we do have really matter.

Juneteenth National Independence Day (June 19) - the only federal holiday in June. It commemorates the day the last enslaved African Americans in Texas were finally told they were free. This is a day to reflect on freedom, equality, and history.

Of course, not every important date is a federal holiday. Some are observed only in specific states. These may be days off for schools or government offices, but only in certain regions:

- ♦ **Jefferson Davis' Birthday (June 2–3 AL, FL).** A controversial observance marking the birthday of the Confederacy's president.
- ◆ **D-Day (June 6th).** This day marks the Allied landings in Normandy during World War II. Veterans are honored, ceremonies are held, and the fallen are remembered.
- Native American Day (June 8 AZ). A tribute to Indigenous peoples, their traditions, languages, and spiritual heritage.
- ♦ Kamehameha Day (June 11 HI). Honors King Kamehameha I, founder of the Hawaiian Kingdom.
- ♦ West Virginia Day (June 20 WV). Celebrates the state's official entry into the Union during the Civil War.
- ♦ First day of Summer or Summer Solstice (June 20). The day with the longest period of sunlight. Notice how the Sun appears highest in the sky at the solstice; its rays strike Earth at a more direct angle, causing the efficient warming we call summer.

June isn't just about warm days and summer fun. It's a month full of meaning, symbols, and powerful stories. There's room for joy, reflection, and coming together. People celebrate, remember, and stand side by side. June brings more than sunshine. It brings connection and care. Every holiday this month offers something to feel, share, or learn.





COOKING CORNER



Diploma Cookies

Enjoy these drop cookies made using Gold Medal® all-purpose flour. Perfect for a graduation day dessert.

Ingredients

1/3 cup butter or margarine, softened

1/3 cup shortening

3/4 cup packed brown sugar

1 tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

½ tsp vanilla

1 egg

1½ cups Gold Medal™ all-purpose flour

¼ cup Gold Medal™ whole wheat flour

3/4 cup semisweet chocolate chips, melted

Directions

- ♦ Beat butter, shortening and brown sugar until creamy. Beat in baking powder, salt, vanilla and egg. Stir in flours. Divide dough in half. Cover and refrigerate about 2 hours.
- ♦ Heat oven to 375°F. Roll each half of dough into 15x6-inch rectangle on floured surface. Cut lengthwise into three 15x2-inch strips. Then cut crosswise into two 7½x2-inch strips. Working quickly, spread about 1 tsp melted chocolate over one strip to within ¼ inch of one long side. Gently roll up, starting at long side with chocolate. Repeat with remaining cookie strips and chocolate. Cut each roll into 2 pieces; roll each cookie slightly to shape. On ungreased cookie sheet, place cookies about 1 inch apart.
- ♦ Bake 8 to 10 minutes or until edges are firm. Cool 1 minute; remove to cooling rack. Cool completely. Place remaining chocolate in plastic bag. Cut hole in corner and squeeze out chocolate to look like bows.

Verona Flats—Essex County

The new affordable housing community, in Verona, NJ. This community has 95 available apartments, underscoring the immense demand for affordable housing in the area.

Woodland View-Camden County
