2025 continues to be a year of progress.

Since 2003 when *People for People Foundation* (a 501c3 grassroots organization) started, our organization (along with partner agencies) has assisted numerous individuals and families with utility assistance along with providing valuable resource and referral services.

People for People still partners with **SHARES**. As you may know, **SHARES** provides energy assistance to moderate and lower-income households experiencing a financial crisis. Eligibility is based on household size and income.

People for People supports the **SHARES** programs with processing and submitting applications from **eligible** clients in need.

To date, *People for People* has processed approximately **242** applicants needing utility assistance with funds of over **\$106,000** granted to clients, and we're still going.

COLUMBUS DAY

Columbus Day, in the United States, a holiday to commemorate the landing of Christopher Columbus in the Americas on October 12, 1492.

Although his explorations were financed by Ferdinand and Isabella, joint rulers of Aragon and Castile (now in Spain), Columbus was a native of Genoa, Italy, and, over the years, Italian Americans took up the cause of honoring his achievement. The 300th anniversary of his landing was celebrated in New York City in 1792 by the Society of St. Tammany, or the Columbian Order, a benevolent fraternal organization that had been founded in that city in 1789 to promote patriotism and the principles of democracy.

However, the direct incentive for declaring the anniversary of Columbus's arrival was the mass lynching of 11 Italian Americans in New Orleans in 1891. One of the largest lynchings in U.S. history, it occurred during a time of widespread anti-immigrant and anti-Italian sentiment in the country and one year after the murder of New Orleans' police chief, which was blamed on the city's Italian population. In all, 19 Italians were to be tried for the murder. The weak evidence was exposed when 6 of the accused were acquitted and 3 were granted mistrials. Before the rest of the accused could be tried, a mob stormed the city's prison and shot to death 11 Italians (a few of whom were not among the accused). The event threatened diplomatic relations between Italy and the United States and, to appease the Italian government, U.S. Pres. Benjamin Harrison proclaimed the 400th anniversary of Columbus's arrival a national holiday in 1892, intending it to be a one-time celebration.

During the latter half of the 19th century, the day had begun to be celebrated in cities with large numbers of Italian Americans, and in 1937 it became an annual federal holiday by presidential proclamation.

The day came to be marked by parades, often including floats depicting the ships of Columbus's voyages, and by public ceremonies and festivities. However, by the quincentennial in 1992, the holiday had become an occasion for discussing the European conquest of Native peoples.

This year, Columbus Day will be observed on the 2nd Monday in October (October 13, 2025).



HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

Halloween safety tips are essential for ensuring a fun and secure experience. Here are some key recommendations:

For Trick-or-Treaters:

- Visibility is Key: Wear bright-colored costumes, add reflective tape, and carry glow sticks or flashlights to be seen by drivers at night.
- ♦ Costume Safety: Choose costumes that fit properly and are made of fire-resistant material to prevent trips and burns. Use face paint instead of masks to avoid vision obstruction.
- Stay Safe While Walking: Stay on sidewalks and cross only at intersections or crosswalks. Walk in groups and never go alone.
- Candy Safety: Wait until you get home to eat treats. An adult should inspect all candy and throw away any unwrapped, opened, or homemade items.

For Drivers:



- Be Alert: Drive slowly in residential areas and be extra alert for pedestrians.
- Visibility: Turn on your headlights early in the day to see children better, especially at dusk.
- Watch for Kids: Scan the road and be prepared for children who may dart into the street.

For Homeowners:

- Make Your Home Visible: Turn on your porch light and ensure the path to your door is well-lit to guide trick-ortreaters
- Clear the Walkway: Remove any tripping hazards from your lawn, steps, and walkway.
- Pet Safety: Keep pets safely inside to avoid them startling or biting trick-or-treaters.
- Pumpkin Safety: Use battery-operated candles or glow sticks instead of real candles in jack-o'-lanterns to prevent burns.









COOKING CORNER



Slow-Cooker Butternut Squash Soup

Cream cheese is the secret to a creamy ready-when-you-want-it squash soup

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp butter or margarine
- 1 medium onion, chopped (½ cup)
- 1 butternut squash (2 lbs.), peeled and cubed
- 2 cups water
- ½ tsp dried marjoram leaves
- 1/4 tsp ground black pepper
- 1/8 tsp ground red pepper (cayenne)
- 4 chicken bouillon cubes
- package (8 oz) cream cheese, cubed

Directions

- In 10-inch skillet, melt butter over medium heat. Add onion; cook, stirring occasionally, until crisp-tender.
- In 3- to 4-quart slow cooker, mix onion and remaining ingredients except cream cheese.
- ♦ Cover; cook on low heat setting 6 to 8 hours.
- ♦ In blender or food processor, place one-third to one-half of mixture at a time. Cover; blend on high speed until smooth. Return mixture to slow cooker. Stir in cream cheese. Cover; cook on low heat setting about 30 minutes longer or until cheese is melted, stirring with wire whisk until smooth.

Verona Flats—Essex County

The new affordable housing community, in Verona, NJ. This community has 95 available apartments, underscoring the immense demand for affordable housing in the area.
